- CONTRACT PERIOD:** The contract issued as a result of this bid request shall run from August 1, 2019 through July 31, 2020. The bread price submitted shall continue in force during the entire contract period.
- AWARDS:** Awards will normally be made to the low bidder, provided service and quality are considered to be equal to that offered by other bidders, but the right is reserved to make the award to other than the low bidder when it is in the best interest of the Patrick county Public Schools to do so. The Patrick County Public Schools will be the sole judge as to conditions affecting such interest.
- PRODUCT FRESHNESS:** It is the responsibility of the successful bidder to assure product freshness at all times. Previously frozen items are not acceptable.
- SANITATION:** All bakery products shall be prepared from first quality materials and produced under absolute sanitary conditions, both as to premises and employees.
- PACKAGING:** All baked products shall be encased in sanitary wrappers or containers, which shall be sufficiently strong and tight to exclude dirt and moisture.
- DELIVERY:** Deliveries shall be made to each school not less than twice a week, as ordered; and at such hours as specified by and arranged with the receiving school's kitchen manager. It is the responsibility of the successful bidder to place all deliveries in proper areas within each school. No delivery is to be left outside on dock or porch. If found in these areas, product must be replaced at the expense of the vendor. All sales slips must be reviewed and signed by an authorized school employee before the driver leaves the school. Must provide 2 receipts to cafeteria manager. All school orders will be faxed or emailed weekly from the central food service office for delivery the following week. No delivery before 7:00 a.m., nor after 3:00 p.m.
- SUBSTITUTES:** Items not on the quotation listing shall "not "be delivered without prior approval of the school nutrition coordinator. If a substitute is necessary, delivery of an equal or superior product at an equal or lower price is permitted.
- SAMPLES:** It will be the responsibility of the successful bidder to supply samples of all items upon request.
- NUTRIENT ANALYSIS:** The nutrient analysis for each item quoted is required with the quotation.
- EXTENDING SERVICE:** The school division may request the option of extending service if both the bread company and the school division are satisfied with the contracted service at the conclusion of each school year for a period not to exceed five (5) school years.
- COLLUSION STATEMENT:** By submitting the attached bid hereby certifies that said bid has not been made or prepared in collusion with any other distributor and that the prices, terms or conditions have not been communicated by or on the behalf of the bidder to any other distributor and will not be so communicated to any other distributor prior to the official opening of the said bid.

Code of Conduct for Food Services Procurement

Procedures

The Patrick County Public School District seeks to conduct all procurement procedures:

- in compliance with stated regulations; and
- to prohibit conflicts of interest and actions of employees engaged in the selection, award and administration of contracts.

No employee, officer, or agent may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by a Federal, State, or local award if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict of interest would arise when the employee, officer, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.

The officers, employees, and agents of the non-Federal entity may neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts. However, non-Federal entities may set standards for situations in which the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal value.

The standards of conduct must provide for disciplinary actions to be applied for violations of such standards by officers, employees, or agents of the non-Federal entity. Based on the severity of the infraction, the penalties could include a written reprimand to their personnel file, a suspension with or without pay, or termination.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS - CERTIFICATION/DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO LOBBYING

Section 319 of Public Law 101-121 (31 U.S.C.), signed into law on October 23, 1989, imposes new prohibitions and requirements for disclosure and certification related to lobbying on recipients of Federal contracts, grants, cooperative agreements, and loans. Certain provisions of the law also apply to Federal commitments for loan guarantees and insurance; however, it provided exemptions for Indian tribes and tribal organizations.

Effective December 23, 1989, current and prospective recipients (and their sub-tier contractors and/or sub-grantees) will be prohibited from using Federal funds, other than profits from a Federal contract, for lobbying Congress or any Federal agency in connection with the award of a particular contract, grant, cooperative agreement or loan.
